After work I want to eat. I love meat. My favourite is a big steak. No vegetables. Only steak.

In the evening we sometimes go out. Before we go out my girlfriend looks at my clothes and she usually says: "No, Ivan. Change!" I'm not interested in clothes, but I love watches. I have seven, including a Montblanc, three Rolexes, and a Maurice Lacroix. Sometimes, I don't go to bed until 1.00 or 2.00. It's often difficult to sleep. I have a lot of things in my head.
